SUBJECT: Retailer Water Use Reductions by Calendar DATE: March 23, 2021

Year

Please see the table below that summarizes the retailer water use reductions achieved from 2014 through 2020, an average savings of 21 percent, when compared to the same time period in 2013. Through December 2020, the combined reduction for the retailers is approximately 16 percent, which is below the 20 percent voluntary target adopted by the Board on June 13, 2017. The Conservation Program continues its outreach and messaging to ensure conservation is a California way of life.

Future updates will be provided to the Board annually.
