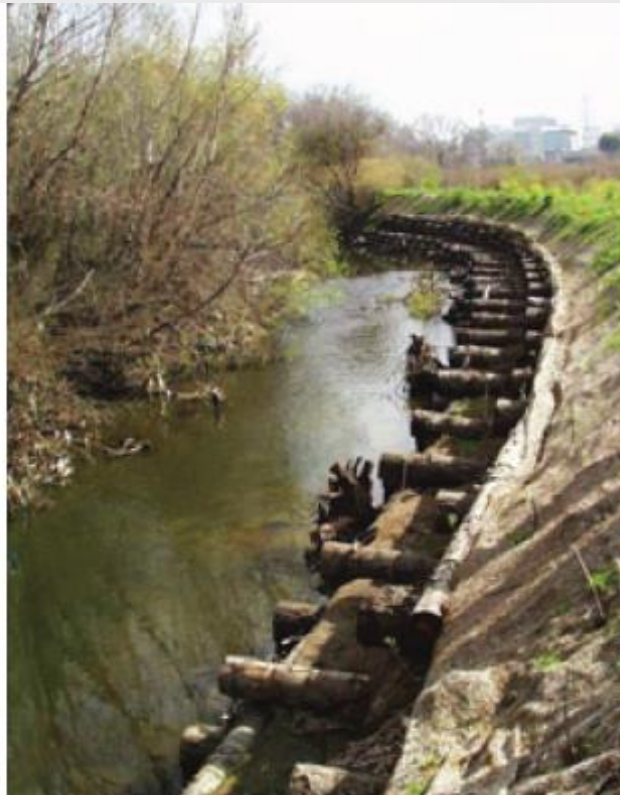

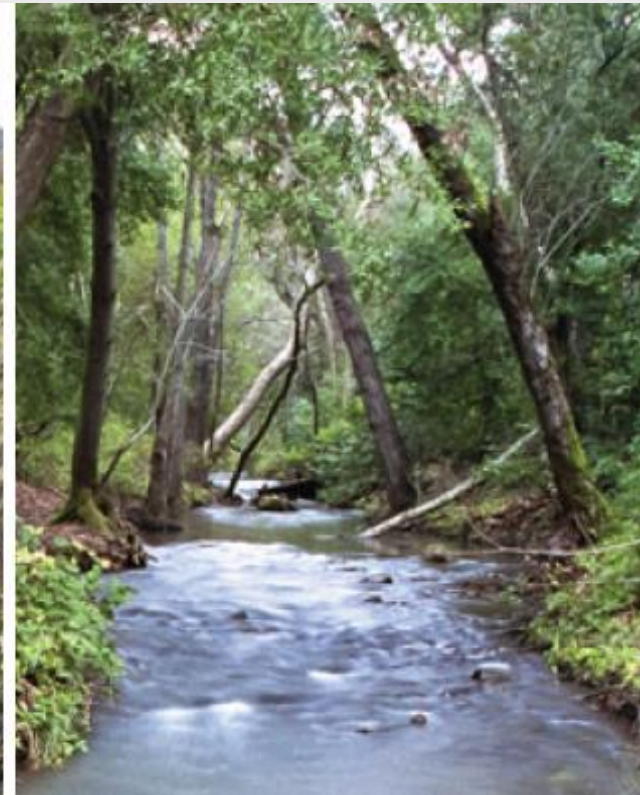
Mission: Providing Silicon Valley safe, clean water for a healthy life, environment and economy

- ▶ Funded through a voter approved ballot measure
- ▶ The grants program addresses key performance indicators associated with program priorities

A 15-year program to:

- Ensure a safe, reliable water supply
- Reduce toxins, hazards and contaminants in waterways
- Protect water supply and dams from earthquakes and natural disasters
- Restore wildlife habitat and provide open space
- Provide flood protection to homes, schools and businesses

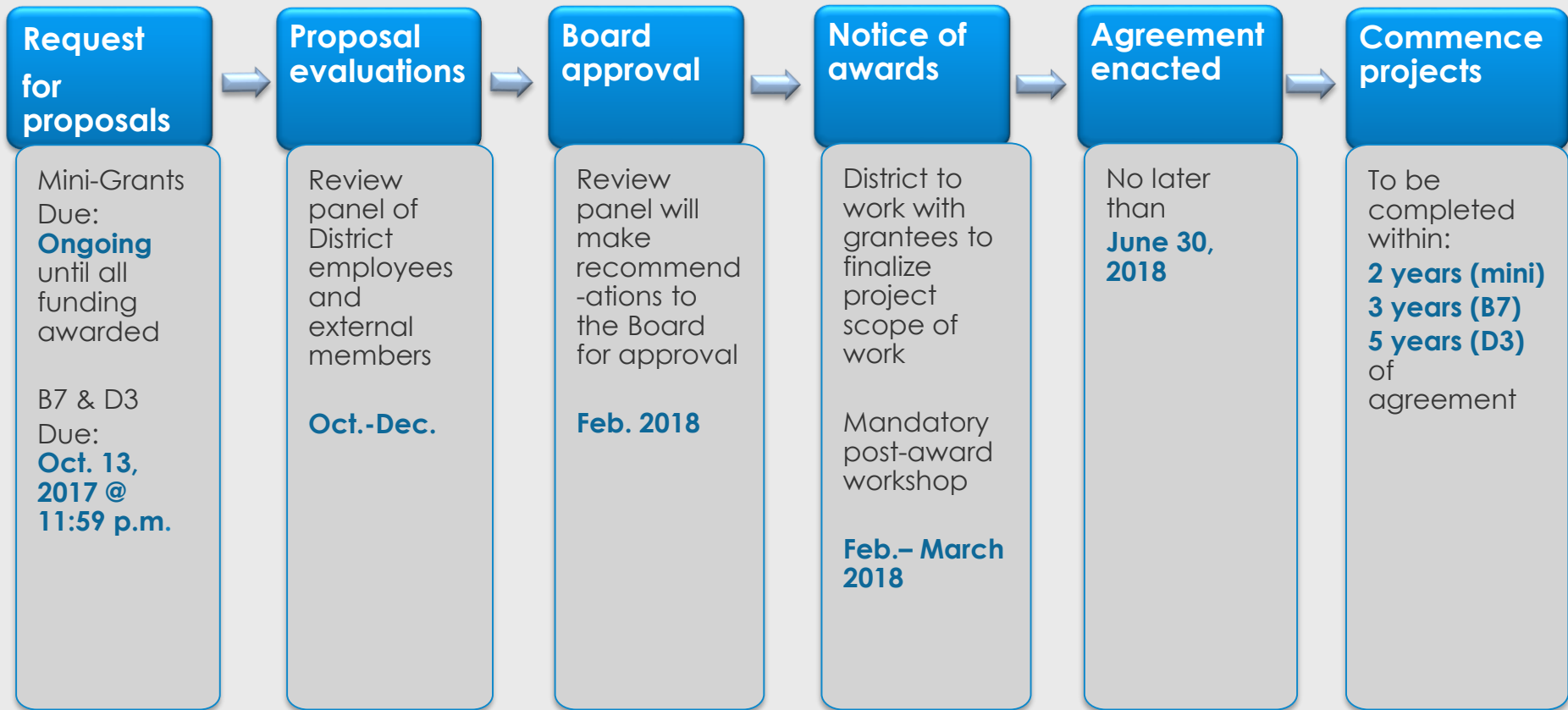

Acterra	B7 Support Volunteer Cleanup Efforts & Education	Acterra Lower Peninsula Healthy Creeks Project	The project brings together the resources and talents of nonprofit organizations, academic institutions, municipalities, government agencies, and the general public to provide a variety of hands-on creek stewardship activities and watershed education events designed to attract participants of all ages.
Clean Water Fund	B7 Support Volunteer Cleanup Efforts & Education	ReThink Disposable: Preventing Riparian Trash at the Source	This is the continuation and expansion of a public-private partnership project involving Clean Water Fund, and local government. The project (originally called Taking out the Trash), is currently a partnership with the cities of Oakland, San José, South San Francisco, San Francisco, the County of San Mateo, and Stop Waste of Alameda County.
Girl Scouts of Northern America	B7 Support Volunteer Cleanup Efforts & Education	Girl Scouts Go Green in Santa Clara County	Implement an environmental outreach and education program focusing on providing education and outreach to reduce pharmaceutical waste and other pollutants in our waterways.
County of Santa Clara	D3 Access to Trails & Open Space	Calero County Park Oak Cove & North Shore Trails	Construct approximately 5 miles natural-surface multi-use trails adjacent to Calero Reservoir.
Santa Clara Open Space Authority	D3 Access to Trails & Open Space	Outdoor Learning Center and Creek Side Valley Loop Trail	Construct an Outdoor Learning Center within the 348-acre Coyote Valley Open Space Reserve, to serve as an outdoor classroom, a meeting location for educational and interpretive programs. This project also incorporated a 0.6 miles of ADA accessible trail.
West Valley College	D3 Access to Trails & Open Space	Vasona Creek Trail	The project will provide 0.33 miles of new ADA accessible trails within the West Valley College Campus.

The Santa Clara Valley District (District) manages an integrated water resources system that includes the supply of clean, safe water, flood protection and stewardship of streams on behalf of Santa Clara County's 1.9 million residents. The District's mission is to provide Silicon Valley safe, clean water for a healthy life, environment, and economy.

SAFE, CLEAN WATER GRANT PROGRAM

The Safe, Clean Water and Natural Flood Protection Program (Safe, Clean Water Program) is a 15-year strategy approved by voters in 2012 to ensure uninterrupted water resources services in Santa Clara County. The grants program is being implemented to address key performance indicators associated with priorities identified in the Safe, Clean Water Program.

For this funding cycle, the District will award grants for the following Safe, Clean Water Program priorities:

- B7 Support Volunteer Cleanup Efforts and Education
- D3 Access to Trails and Open Space
- D3 Restore Wildlife Habitat

FUNDING AVAILABILITY

For this grant cycle, the following funding are available for each priority:

- B7 Support Volunteer Cleanup Efforts and Education: \$200,000 (not to exceed \$50,000 per grant award)
- D3 Access to Trails and Open Space: \$571,000 (minimum of \$25,000 per grant award)
- D3 Restore Wildlife Habitat: \$200,000 (mini grants not to exceed \$5,000 per award)
